SUMMARY:

Following the 2025 Shire of Broome Election and the official Declaration Ceremony, Council is required to elect a Deputy Shire President for a two year term of office. The elected Deputy Shire President is then required to make the Declaration.

BACKGROUND

The procedure for electing the Deputy Shire President is set out in Schedule 2.3, Division 2 of the Local Government Act 1995 (the Act).

The Shire President will advise of any nominations received prior to the meeting and call for any further nominations. Where there is more than 1 nomination a secret ballot will be held.

In the case that a ballot is required and in accordance with Regulation 11A of the Local Government (Constitution) Regulations 1998 (the Regulations), the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) will provide printed ballot papers, with nominees listed alphabetically. Ballot papers must be cast as per the process for the election of a Council Member (or Shire President), i.e. using the optional preferential voting method. To be successful, a candidate must achieve an Absolute Majority of votes, being 50% of the total votes plus 1 vote. Should there be an exhaustion of votes cast, the candidate with the highest number of votes, after preferences have been allocated, as far as is possible, will be declared the Deputy Shire President.

The CEO is to declare and give notice of the result in accordance with Regulation 11F of the Regulations.

The Deputy Shire President will be required to make a declaration as per section 2.29 of the Act.

If, when the votes cast are counted, there is a draw of votes between two or more candidates, the count is to be discontinued and, not more than seven days later, a special meeting of council is to be held. If possible, such a Special Meeting could be convened within 30 minutes, if there is a prospect of an outcome in the second ballot. The Shire President will announce when the special meeting is to be scheduled.

STATUTORY ENVIRONMENT

Local Government Act 1995.

Section 2.29

Schedule 2.3, Division 2, Clause 8

- 8. How deputy mayor or deputy president is elected
 - (1) The council is to elect a councillor (other than the mayor or president) to fill the office.
 - (2) The election is to be conducted in accordance with the procedure prescribed by the mayor or president, or if he or she is not present, by the CEO.
 - (3) Nominations for the office are to be given to the person conducting the election in writing before the meeting or during the meeting before the close of nominations.
 - (3a) Nominations close at the meeting at a time announced by the person conducting the election, which is to be a sufficient time after the announcement by that person that nominations are about to close to allow for any nominations made to be dealt with.
 - (4) If a councillor is nominated by another councillor the person conducting the election is not to accept the nomination unless the nominee has advised the person conducting the election, orally or in writing, that he or she is willing to be nominated for the office.
 - (5) The council members are to vote on the matter by secret ballot as if they were electors voting at an election.
 - (6) Subject to clause 9(1) the votes cast under subclause (5) are to be counted, and the successful candidate determined, in accordance with Schedule 4.1 as if those votes were votes cast at an election.
 - (7) As soon as is practicable after the result of the election is known, the person conducting the election is to declare and give notice of the result in accordance with regulations, if any.
